Nicene Creed

1988 ecumenical (ELLC) version, Lutheran variation, revised by and for David Spakes

I believe in one God,
the Father Almighty,
maker of heaven and earth
and of all things visible and invisible.

And in one Lord Jesus Christ,
the only-begotten Son of God,
begotten of His Father before all worlds,
God of God, Light of Light,
very God of very God,
begotten, not made,
being of one substance with the Father,
by whom all things were made;
who for us men and for our salvation came down from heaven
and was incarnate by the Holy Spirit of the Virgin Mary
and was made man;
and was crucified also for us under Pontius Pilate.
He suffered, died, and was buried.
And the third day the Father raised him again according to the Scriptures.
He ascended into heaven
and sits at the right hand of the Father.
And he will come again with glory to judge both the living and the dead,
whose kingdom will have no end.

And I believe in the Holy Spirit,
the Comforter and giver of life,
who proceeds from the Father and the Son,
who spoke by the prophets
and speaks today to those who are looking for him and recognize him.

And I believe in the Church established and built by Jesus Christ
through the acts of the Holy Spirit
and the obedience of the apostles, apostolic,
